# **Proposed Changes to the USMS Rules of Competition**

9/27/08, House of Delegate Results

The following proposals have been submitted, in accordance with section 601.2 to the Rules Committee for consideration by the House of Delegates at the 2008 Convention.

Please note that many of the proposed changes are from review work done by the Rules Committee and are a matter of clarifying, reorganizing, maintaining consistency, and updating rules.

The real substantive proposals are R 11, R 18, R 21, R 30, R 31, R 35, R 51, R 52, and R 53.

Others of some substance are R 4, R 6, R 12, R 16, R 22, R 27, R 29, R 32, R 33, R 34, R 37, R 38, R 39, R 47, R 50, and R 54.

**Stroke** – Standing in or on the gutter, or <u>placing the toes above the lip of the gutter</u>, or <u>curling bending</u> the toes over the lip of the gutter immediately after the start is not permitted. The swimmer shall push off on the back...head must have broken the surface of the water.

Rationale: To match the language of 101.1.2B and the corresponding USA Swimming language.

An official time shall be achieved in a USMS-sanctioned competition or a <u>USMS-</u>recognized event in accordance with all applicable rules. It may be achieved in:

**Official Time** – An official time for an event or stroke can be achieved only in that event or stroke, or in an initial distance of such stroke or event (e.g., a backstroke time must be achieved in a backstroke event <u>or a</u> <u>butterfly time can be achieved in an individual medley event</u>). Regardless of the stroke(s) used, times achieved in freestyle events can be recorded only as freestyle times.

Rationale: To clarify that the first one-fourth of the individual medley is also the initial distance of that event.

A Solicitation of bids—The USMS Championship Committee shall be responsible for the solicitation of bids and for each short and long course championship with emphasis on soliciting bids from all areas of the country. The committee shall present a list of all certified bidders for each short and long course championships to the House of Delegates at the annual meeting held more than one year prior to the meet being contested, with emphasis on soliciting bids from all areas of the country.

Rationale: Clarify the process.

**Meet Evaluation Committee**—A five-member meet evaluation committee shall be composed of at least three Championship Committee members<del>, plus</del> and two additional USMS members who are knowledgeable in championship procedures. No member of the protest committee, host club or host LMSC may shall serve on the meet evaluation committee. A written evaluation shall be submitted to the meet host.

Rationale: Change "plus" to "and" and "may" to "shall" (it's mandatory).

(1) USMS membership—USMS individual membership numbers and club names and abbreviations must be submitted on all entry forms together with entry times. "Pending" (except for 18-year-olds) for membership number will shall not be permitted. An 18-year-old must enter the meet by the entry deadline and must register for USMS membership prior to the first day of the meet. An 18-year-old may register for USMS membership at the championship venue on the day prior to the beginning of competition and must be 18 by that date.

(3) Affiliation—A swimmer's affiliation as stated on the entry form will shall apply throughout the meet. If the club on the entry form and the club listed in the USMS membership database do not match, the swimmer shall, prior to the first day of competition, submit a new USMS membership card showing the new affiliation. If there are any questions about club affiliation, the swimmer will shall be switched to unattached status for the duration of the meet, regardless of actual affiliation. A swimmer may declare unattached status at any time.

Rationale: Change "will" to "shall" because it's mandatory.

(2) **Relay entry deadline**—A relay may be entered until the day before it is scheduled to be swum. Participants therein must have entered the meet by the individual entry deadline. A fee of \$12 per relay as determined by the Championship Committee shall be charged for all each relays.

*Rationale:* Move last sentence to section on entry fees (104.5.4D[1]) and remove the dollar amount, allowing the Championship Committee to set that amount as policy.

(3) **Postmark deadline**—The meet director may establish a U.S. Postal Service postmark deadline seven days prior to the individual entry deadline. If a postmark deadline is established, individual and relay entries postmarked by a U.S. Postal Service office in the 50 states by midnight of that date will shall be considered on time. Private or corporate meter postmarks will not be accepted.

Rationale: Change "will" to "shall", mandatory.

## **Club Scoring**

- B Categories—Club scoring will be tabulated in three two categories.
  - (1) <u>Regional Clubs</u>Women's women's individual events and women's relay events. For competition at national championship meets, a "Regional Club" consists of a club made up of those swimmers who represent a club at nationals, but at competitions within their LMSC, they compete for an entity or subgroup (such as a workout group) that is different than the one they compete with at nationals.
  - (2) <u>Local Clubs</u>Men's men's individual events and men's relay events. For competition at national championship meets, a "Local Club" consists of a club that does not qualify as a Regional <u>Club.</u>

(3) Combined women's individual events, women's relay events, men's individual events, men's relay events and mixed relay events.

(3) <u>The Championship Committee shall publish a list of Regional and Local Clubs no later than</u> <u>February 15 of each year</u>. A club may contest its designation by filing an appeal with the chair of <u>the Championship Committee at least 45 days prior to the national championship meet</u>.

*Rationale:* Provide a more equitable means of scoring the National Championships by proposing two scoring divisions and giving awards for combined club scoring only  $(1^{st} - 10^{th})$  in each category.

**Team** <u>Club</u> awards – The organization conducting the national championship meet shall provide awards to the first through tenth place <u>clubs</u> winners in the women's, men's and combined categories for two categories: the Regional Club category and the Local Club category. Points scored for a club will be the sum of all points scored by members competing for that club in events for men, women, and relays.

## **Protest Procedure**

**B** Protests affecting the eligibility of an individual,  $\Theta r$  a <u>relay</u> team, <u>or a club</u> to compete, or protests arising from the competition itself, shall be handled by a panel of five persons comprised of one representative each from the Championship Committee and Rules Committee, if present, plus three other participants selected from other than the host team <u>club</u> by the protest panel chair or Championship Committee liaison. This panel shall be chaired by the representative from the Championship Committee. Protests shall be submitted in writing, heard by the panel and decisions rendered no later than the last day of competition. Both the party lodging the protest and the party charged shall be afforded a chance to be heard. The decision of the panel shall be final.

Rationale: More accurate description of eligibility protests. Part 1 deals with relay teams or clubs.

## **B** Officials –

The minimum number of officials at each session of a USMS national championship meet shall include the following:

One meet referee One deck referee for each course One administrative referee One starter for each course Two stroke and turn judges for each course.

The meet host shall appoint a meet referee and an administrative referee subject to qualification standards established by the USMS officials committee. A head starter shall also be assigned.

The following positions shall be assigned for each session: one deck referee for each course one starter for each course, one chief judge for each course.

A sufficient number of stroke and turn judges shall be assigned in order to provide fair and equitable jurisdictions per 103.10.4.

In addition to the officials listed above, additional officials may be assigned in order to provide adequate relief for all officials during each session.

All officials shall be certified by USA Swimming, USMS, YMCA or any other USMS-approved certifying body <u>in the capacity to which they are assigned</u>. An official may serve in only one officiating position during any event, except that during freestyle events 400 meters and longer, the referee and starter may double as stroke and turn judges.

**C** Other personnel - The minimum other personnel at each session of a USMS national championship meet shall include the following:

Two timers per lane for each course, each using a backup button and at least one timer using a stopwatch One recall rope operator for each course if a recall rope is used

One safety marshal for each end of each pool in use for warm-ups.

A sufficient number of administrative officials (including timing equipment operators) shall be assigned to ensure that rules and procedures regarding seeding, official time determination, results, and certification of records are followed.

## **D** Availability of Officials

In the event of insufficient personnel, the meet referee may modify or combine assignments, except that the deck referee and starter may not be the same person and lane timers may not operate two similar timing devices simultaneously.

*Rationale:* The current rule does not adequately describe the number of officials needed to run a National Championship meet.

**B** A statement of the conditions under which the course was measured must be included <u>as stipulated on the</u> <u>USMS Pool Length Certification Form (Appendix B)</u>.

- **D** The swimmer(s) completes the full distance of the scheduled event without being disqualified and performs a legal finish at the initial distance.
- E The swimmer's relay leadoff split time shall not count if the second swimmer starts in the water.

Such split times shall be included separately in the summary of results prepared by the meet director and submitted to the LMSC Top 10 recorder.

## **Bidding Procedures**

A Solicitation of bids—The USMS Championship Committee shall be responsible for the solicitation

of bids and shall present a list of all certified bidders for each short and long course championships to the House of Delegates at the annual meeting held more than one year prior to the meet being contested, with emphasis on soliciting bids from all areas of the country.

- **F** Awarding of bids —At the annual meeting of the House of Delegates, those bids that are certified shall be presented. The awarding of the bid shall be made by majority vote of the House of Delegates. National championship meets shall be awarded by the Championship Committee. The committee may award championships 1-3 years in advance of the national championship meet.
- *Rationale:* Recently the bidding system has had only one bid for each of the national championships. The presentation process at convention has been quite a negative experience for those who spent a great deal of time and money on their bid and were not selected in the past; so they do not bid again. Currently the Championship Committee writes to many facilities encouraging them to bid. A Championship subcommittee will identify and actively see potential bidders from all areas of the United States, streamlining the process and ensuring high quality facilities capable of successfully hosting a national championship. Championship policy dictates that the winning bid will be presented to the House of Delegates.

## Seeding

- A General procedures for seeding (also see article 102.10)
  - (3) Deck-seeded e Events 200 100 yards/meters or less shall be seeded, with oldest age groups first, slowest heats swum first in each age group. In the event that swimmers of the same gender are simultaneously swimming in two courses, the Championship Committee may authorize some alteration of this rule to allow for smooth progress of the meet.
  - (4) Events 400 200 yards/meters and longer shall be deck-seeded by one of the following methods:
    (a) by entry time only, (b) by age group, the oldest age group first, slowest heats seeded first within each age group, then by time or (c) by a combination of (a) and (b). The USMS Championship Committee shall make all seeding decisions.
  - *Rationale:* This option <u>could</u> be used to trim the timeline at a very large nationals. This option would only be used at LCM nationals with unusually long predicted timelines. Dropping the 6<sup>th</sup> event does not necessarily cut the timeline by much. 134 minutes would have been saved for the 200 nonfree events and the 400 free events at Oregon's LCM nationals (154 minutes if the 200 is included). Many heats would also be more competitive if seeded by time.

#### **Event Limit**

**B Relays**—Each competitor shall be allowed to swim in only one freestyle relay, one medley relay, one mixed freestyle relay and one mixed medley relay of each distance per meet., to a maximum number of relays for each competitor as determined by the Championship Committee.

*Rationale:* To allow the Championship Committee to determine the relay limit per swimmer when using different relay formats. (Note that the first sentence prevents a swimmer from competing in, for example, the 25+ age group and the 35+ age group of the 200 free relay.)

**Stroke**—After the start and after each turn when the swimmer leaves the wall, the body shall be kept on the breast. It is not permitted to roll onto the back at any time. Throughout the race the stroke cycle must be one arm stroke and one leg kick in that order.

All movements of the arms shall be simultaneous and in the same horizontal plane without alternating movement.

The hands shall be pushed forward together from the breast on, under or over the water. The elbows shall be under water except for the final stroke before the turn, during the turn and for the final stroke at the finish. The hands shall be brought back on or under the surface of the water. The hands shall not be brought back beyond the hip line, except during the first stroke after the start and each turn.

During each complete cycle, some part of the swimmer's head shall break the surface of the water. After the start and after each turn, the swimmer may take one arm stroke completely back to the legs. The head must break the surface of the water before the hands turn inward at the widest part of the second stroke.

Rationale: Easier to read and matches USA Swimming language.

The feet must be turned outwards during the propulsive part of the kick. A scissors, flutter or downward butterfly (dolphin) kick is not permitted except as provided herein. Breaking the surface of the water with the feet is allowed unless followed by a downward butterfly (dolphin) kick.

Rationale: Easier to read and matches USA Swimming language.

## Disqualifications

A disqualification can be made only by the official within whose jurisdiction the infraction has been committed. Except for the relay takeoff judges when dual confirmation relay takeoff judging, as provided in article 103.10.5B, is used tThe referee, stroke, turn or relay takeoff judge, upon observing an infraction, shall immediately raise one hand overhead. If the official does not do so, there shall be no disqualification. ## **Pool Measurement**

A The exact length of the course <u>must be</u> measured for all lanes using a steel tape or other acceptable measuring device. <u>The measurement in feet and inches and fractions of an inch, or in meters and centimeters</u> must be attested to by the person performing the measurements. <u>The measurement must be recorded:</u>

- 1. in feet and inches and fractions of an inch or
- 2. in meters and centimeters.

*Rationale:* To allow measurement in fractions or decimals (e.g., tenths and hundredths of a foot) in a short phrase. Language further clarifying the details of measurement accuracy will be added to the instructions for the pool length certification form.

## **Club Scoring**

**B** <u>Categories</u> <u>Overall</u> <u>Club</u> Scoring – Club scoring <u>based on the total individual and relay points earned by a club</u> will be tabulated in three categories.

1. Women's – women's individual events and women's relay events.

2. Men's – men's individual events and men's relay events.

3. Combined – women's individual events, women's relay events, men's individual events, men's relay events and mixed relay events.

C Quality Club Scoring – Club scoring based on the average points per swimmer scored by each club will be tabulated as follows: divide each club's total individual and relay points by the number of swimmers entered for the club. A club must have at least four swimmers entered in the meet to be eligible for the Quality Club award. Quality club scoring will be tabulated in three categories.

1. Women's – women's individual events and women's relay events.

2. Men's - men's individual events and men's relay events.

<u>3. Combined – women's individual events, women's relay events, men's individual events, men's relay events and mixed relay events.</u>

**D** Overall Point Totals – The overall point totals for each club <u>and the quality point totals for each eligible</u> <u>club</u> shall be published in all results documentation.

*Rationale:* This will reward clubs in two categories. Overall Club Scoring will reward clubs that bring a large number of swimmers to the National Championship. Quality Club Scoring will reward clubs based on performance only (average points per swimmer) rather than club size. The Ohio LMSC has used this club award system for the last year and a half with a 98% approval rating from coaches and swimmers in the LMSC.

## **Club Scoring**

A Scoring – All national championship meet scoring and awards shall be treated as if the meet were swum in a 10-lane pool, regardless of the actual number of lanes available. Points shall be awarded as in article 102.12.3. Club scoring will be tabulated as specified by the Championship Committee.

B Categories - Club scoring will be tabulated in three categories.

(1) Women's women's individual events and women's relay events.

(2) Men's – men's individual events and men's relay events.

(3) Combined – women's individual events, women's relay events, men's individual events, men's relay events, and mixed relay events

*Rationale:* This proposal would remove specifics of the scoring structure from the rule book and allow the Championship Committee to recommend to the HOD a scoring proposal. The HOD would then either approve the recommendation or change the recommendation and this would bind the Championship Committee to do whatever the HOD approves on a yearly basis. The advantage of doing this is that no specific scoring structure is outlined in the rule book and scoring could be modified from year to year as we find what works best.

PLEASE NOTE: For this year, the Championship Committee has voted at this convention to abide by whatever scoring method that the majority of the HOD favors, e.g. R 30, R 31, and/or any amendments made by the HOD.
