# Craft Brewery Light Rail Crawl

Minneapolis has experienced a burst of Craft Breweries in recent years, many within easy walking distance of the Light Rail. Check out these convenient options:

**Surly Brewing.** Minnesota's own Destination Brewery located just a few blocks from the U of M campus. Exit the Green Line at the Prospect Park Station. Walk two block East on University, then two blocks North on Malcom.
