Interim Report - March 2003

Top-Ten Tabulations for 2002 Long-Course Meters and 2002 Short-Course Meters were sent to the printer and published on schedule.

The 2002 All-American tabulation was prepared and sent to the National Office for verification and publishing.

NQT tabulations were sent to the Championship Committee.

The 2002 Relay All-American tabulation was prepared and sent to all Committee Members, Top-Ten Recorders and to all the Clubs that were listed on the tabulation.

Walt Reid continues to process all record applications and supplies the record information that is included in the Top-Ten Publications. The Top-Ten subscription list is now maintained by the National Office.

There are two issues the Committee will be working on this year:

1. USMS has instituted a permanent swimmers ID. In the future Top-Ten recorders need to include USMS registration numbers in their submissions. We will discuss how this can be accomplished and what kind of procedures we can put in place to accomplish this.
2. Recognized meets need an officially appointed observer to report on the conduct of the meet. Several meets, this year and in the past have been recognized "after the fact" by the Executive Committee. I would like to start a discussion on submitting a rules-change proposal (rule 202.2) to correct this problem.
