Key responsibilities

- Coach, counsel and ban users.
- Remove/edit improper posts and threads.

Recommended skills, experience and attributes

- Good communication with effective writing skills.
- Editorial experience is helpful.
- Moderators should be impartial, fair, polite and firm while dealing with the forum members.
- They should possess fluent language skills and in-depth knowledge in Masters Swimming.
- They usually do not participate in ongoing controversial discussions on sensitive topics (like religion or politics) or even if they do, they generally do not express strong or extreme opinions either way.
- Moderate computer skills and access to internet.

Recommended training

- Training on forum Moderation and Administrative tools.
- Training on IP search tools (needed to verify new members)
