Results for "Go the Distance" August, 2008

Goodness gracious - we're still growing! The USMS Fitness Event "Go the Distance" (GTD) would like to extend a warm welcome to our eleven new participants: Rick, Paula, James, Mark, Sylvia, Jim, Rachael, Laura, Craig, Rebecca and Steve. We hope you have a great time and lots of fun with this event!

The most popular GTD distance milestone achieved in August was the "200 miles" distance milestone that 45 participants conquered - way to go folks! Curious (but not too surprising) ... is our average as a group (579 participants) is 190.02 miles!

We have seven participants that have achieved their first 50 miles - a hearty congratulations to you all - you did it!

There was apparently a lot of swimming going on around the nation in August! We had 26 participants passing "100 miles", 33 more swimming more than "150 miles" and 37 now have over "250 miles" logged this year. We also have 20 more passing the "300 mile" threshold, and 14 more that have made the 365.25 (average mile a day) goal. The "400 miles" challenge was met by another 12 participants and the "500 miles" milestone was cracked by 7 folks.

On the GTD Xtreme end we have 1 additional participant that has now swum more than "750 miles" so far this year as well as 2 more who broke the "1000 mile" barrier and last but not least, our leader now has 1573.21 miles and has achieved the highest GTD distance milestone of "1500 miles"!!

Our GTD total mileage to date for our entire group is now 100,021.17 miles - way to go everyone!
